In May, I had the pleasure of attending the Mayor Making of Fowey, which apart from the ceremonials is a chance to meet with other Councillors. Also on May 22nd, I opened our new retail outlet The Range, a welcome addition to St. Blazey.

On 7th June, I was happy to be part of The Big Lunch, which as you know, was also a Guinness Record attempt for the largest cream tea party. We wait to see if this was successful.

Being a judge at Par Carnival was a delight to see how much effort had been put into all the costumes. It was a great fun day.

In August Cornwall Councillor Doug Scrafton unveiled the explanatory plaque for the Armillary Sphere at Par Running Track and I was happy to be invited to attend. A special thank you must go to Brian Sheen for instigating the procurement of the Sphere.

At the beginning of September, St. Austell welcomed the Bards of the Garsedh and I was privileged to attend, to celebrate all Cornish traditions and language, especially important now that Cornish has been recognized as a national minority.

Two of St Blazey Councillors have completed 20 years' service to the Town, I would like to thank and congratulate both Councillors Adrian Seel and Amos Putt for their hard work during this time and I know that they will both continue to work their hardest for us all.

I and my fellow Councillors were sorry to hear that the Police Station will be closing. The Police are looking for a base for the PCSO's to be based in the Town to avoid us losing policing hours while they travel to and from St Austell. We are looking into ways that this could be accomplished.

I would like to express my gratitude to both our Warden, Dave Pearce and the unpaid work unit for the work that has been carried out on the footpath that runs behind Biscovey School.

The work is continuing and we hope that it will not become unusable this winter due to excessive rain.

As Cornwall Council no longer carry out road side weed control, the Warden has been trained to carry out this work. Unfortunately due to the wet summer we have endured, he has been unable to complete this task as well as he would have liked.

The Burrow Centre has been providing some computer for beginner's classes and these will continue, if you would like to attend one of these 2 hour, 5 week courses please contact the Town Clerk.

I am sure that there are items that I should have mentioned however I hope that you have enjoyed some fine summer weather.

St Blazey and District Town Team, a not for profit business led initiative, have come together to showcase businesses in the area and show visitors projects that are happening.

There was a speed monitoring device put in place on Par Lane recently. It was noted that the device did not detect many vehicles speeding, therefore there is little more that can be done.

The police continue to get complaints regarding anti-social behaviour. The neighbourhood team carry out regular patrols in the relevant areas.

The World's Largest Cream Tea

Gill Butler and along with other members of Par Community association attempted to stage a cream tea for 650 people to beat the current world record of 536 people. Nearly 1200 attended and they broke the record as they were able to record 672 sitting enjoying their teas at the same time.

The afternoon raised £1400 for children in need and a local charity – Beth's Inspiration.

A good time was had by all and the required evidence has been submitted to Guinness World of Records and Gill is waiting for clarification of entry into register.
