Introduction by the Mayor of St Blaise Town Council. Councillor June Anderson.

I attended the Open Day at Chicks Coastal Retreat which is a facility that provides holidays to under privileged children country wide as well as those from Cornwall and some even within our boundaries. I was impressed with the facilities and urge you all to visit should you get the opportunity.

The new plans for Shorthorn beach, part of the Carlyon Bay development have been unveiled and you have all had the opportunity to view them. The development will provide hundreds of permanent jobs and transform the area. The area is to receive significant investment which will boost our areas profile. It will be a world-class resort and will allow access to the beach for local people. The planned development will be an all year round activity site.

You will have all noticed the amount of work that South West Water, the Environment Agency and Cornwall Council Highways Department have been doing in the area. The Integrated modern drainage system that has been installed at Tredenham Close will hopefully improves the lives of the residents of Brook's corner and any of you that have to walk or drive the area in severe wet conditions.

The Environment Agency have cleaned all the waterways throughout the Town and are lowering the depth of St Blazey Stream. Cornwall Council have installed attenuation tanks in the area.

You will have all no doubt seen the boat that has been placed and planted on the A390 at St Blazey Gate. The project was helped to its conclusion with the assistance of the students from Doubletrees School. The St Blazey Community Warden will be responsible for its regular maintenance.

We are fortunate to have a Community Centre in the middle of the Town, next to the Co-op supermarket, this centre can be used for private function as well as Community Groups. If you would like to use the facility please contact Gaynor Mamo who will be happy to accommodate you.

Cornwall Council News.

You are most likely be aware of the significant budget challenges that Cornwall Council, along with most other Councils across the country, is trying to manage. By 2018/19 they will have to make savings totaling £196 million.

Cornwall Council is setting a 4 year budget which is a first. Since 2010 the Council has made savings of £170 million, partially through becoming a Unitary Authority - merging six councils into one. With such a huge challenge, they face the difficult task of having to decide where and how to reduce services.

Cornwall Council held public meetings during October in each of the community network areas where public views were invited.

Neither Cornwall Council or the Town Council are taking their budgeting responsibilities lightly. The Town Council may have to increase its precept to be able to take on additional duties as Cornwall Council will have to reduce theirs.

St Blaise Annual Carol Concert

The Carol concert will be at St Blazey Church on 14th December at 6.00pm. There will be performances by Biscovey Academy Choir and Mount Charles Youth Band, each entertaining us with their solo spots and joining in with us all in singing traditional carols. Afterwards at the reception at the football Club where a Hog Roast, Mulled Wine and Mince Pies can be enjoyed.

We know this will be enjoyed and appreciated, along with the sounds of Biscovey Academy Choir, from the many comments made after previous year's events.
