Report by the Mayor of St Blaise Town Council. Councillor Jenny Moore.

The Town Carol Service will take place on Sunday 14th December at 4 pm at St Blazey Church, do join us for a Celebration of Christmas.

This year's recipient of the Town Council Good Citizen Award is Nigel Coombe. The pandemic has been with us for nearly two years, initially nobody really understood what was happening and how long they would be affected. St Blazey, being the community it is, stepped up to the plate and many came forward to help others, getting prescriptions, shopping etc. and generally helping out.

It could be argued that this award should actually be made to the many in the community who helped out,

without concern for themselves, but one name cropped up time and time again, as someone who quietly went beyond simply helping and who was always there when he was needed. Even now, Nigel is quietly getting on with helping. For this reason, he has been chosen to receive the Good Citizen award – because amongst a magnificent caring community, he has made the greatest contribution.

As many of you know at the beginning of this year the play areas at Penarwyn Green, Polgover Way and Deeble Drive were devolved to the Town Council. The Town Council took them on to avoid their closure.

Deeble Drive – The smallest of the parks has had no new equipment but repairs have been made and the children's chairs and tables will be painted when the weather permits.

Penarwyn Green – The first play area to have new equipment is to currently having additional equipment installed, two spring rockers for the toddlers.

Polgover Way – The installation of the new play equipment is currently taking place.

Trail Blazer Park – The play equipment is nearing the end of its life time and so we have instructed a contractor to make repairs to the zip-wire, the tyre swing and the

see-saw. The safety surfacing gaps are also to be repaired.

We have wonderful parks in St Blazey and it is down to each one of us to see that they remain this way.

Residents of the Town have mentioned that they have difficulty crossing the A390 by the post office. We have been advised that Cornwall Council that the traffic lights by St Blazey Church are due for renewal and may be replaced with lights giving pedestrian crossing rights.

Our Community Warden continues to make St Blazey a very attractive town through his planting and next year the planters will be painted red, white and blue to commemorate our queens platinum jubilee. Cornwall Councillor Pauline Giles has also arranged for the grass verges to be planted with red, white and blue wild flowers.

St Blaise Town Council are bidding for Town Vitality Funding with a focus on improving the Town commercially. We need to understand the town's needs.

Lastly I would like to remind you that there will be no changes to rubbish and recycling collection days this year as Christmas Day and Boxing Day fall on a Saturday and Sunday.
